Plastics and our oceans - a toxic mix?

What is a Decision Making Exercise?

Decision making is an integral part of the enquiry process within Geography. It is part of a concept of Geography that views knowledge and understanding as fluid, partial, and selective. The process of decision making relies on the ability to effectively research a theme or topic, picking out evidence which supports or contradicts a particular viewpoint. Often, a range of options or strategies are offered so that a choice can be made as to which provides the best solution to a particular challenge or scenario. In practical terms, this involves background reading, group discussion, evidence gathering and persuasive presentation.

What skills will you need?

- a. The ability to work well in a team (interdependence)
- b. The ability to be resilient and creative in the face of a problem and to find a way to solve it
- c. The ability to research independently to gain a broad understanding of the issue
- d. The ability to analyse a range of resources to build a well-supported argument
- e. The ability to communicate your ideas passionately, clearly and succinctly to others

The evening itself...

- a. Upon arrival you will first get a presentation on the broad issue, how best to tackle decision making and then be presented with the options from which you have to pick
- b. You will then be provided with some additional resources and given an hour. In this time you will need to make a decision on the best way forward and to produce a supporting poster to help convey your argument
- c. Finally you will enter the presentation phrase where you will make the most compelling argument you can to a rotating carousel of 3 judges. You will be judged on your argument and how well your poster presentation supports you. Your presentation to each judge lasts just a couple of minutes so you will need to be slick, concise and ensure you get to the point.
- d. Finally the scores will be totalled and the victorious team announced.
