



- BSc Geography main programme, 3 years full time, choose 3 from a range of pathways
- (BSc does not equal Physical, can be all Human beyond the 1st year)
- BSc in Geography with Study in Continental Europe
- BSc in Geography with Study Abroad
- BSc/MSci in Geography and Quantitative Methods
- MSci in Geography with Innovation

### Variety of teaching methods

- Lectures: explanation of core topics, integrated with recommended readings
- Tutorials: discussion of selected topics, writing and presentation practice and feedback, usually 8 students
- **Seminars & workshops:** reading groups or activities designed to apply concepts or methods
- Practicals: training in research methods, including hands-on exercises conducted alone and/or in groups
- **Fieldwork:** opportunities to put research skills to use in the field, collecting original data
- Dissertation: an independently planned and executed research project, supported by one-on-one advising















